

Chapter 1.28 - GENERAL PENALTY¹

1.28.010 Designated--Fine payment default procedure.

- A. Any person violating any of the provisions or failing to comply with any of the mandatory requirements of the ordinances of the city shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. Except in cases where a different punishment is prescribed by any ordinance of the city, any person convicted of a misdemeanor under the ordinances of the city shall be punished by a fine of not more than three hundred dollars, or by imprisonment not to exceed thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
- B. Each such person shall be guilty of a separate offense for each and every day during any portion of which any violation of any provision of the ordinances of the city is committed, continued or permitted by any such person, and he shall be punished accordingly.
- C. Any person who is in default of payment of any fine provided in this section, or any other ordinance of the city, shall be imprisoned in the Municipal Jail for a period of one day for each five dollars of such fine, to a maximum of thirty days; provided, however, that no person shall be imprisoned under this provision whose failure to pay such fine results solely from his indigence and consequent financial inability to pay such fine. 1.28.020 Violation--Aiding or abetting prohibited.

It is unlawful for any person, in any way or manner, to aid, abet, counsel, advise or encourage any other person in the commission of any of the acts mentioned herein or in any manner encourage the commission of such offense defined. (Prior code §6-1-2).
