

Chapter 2.32 - CITY WORKS SUPERINTENDENT ¹

2.32.010 Appointment and term of office.

The mayor may appoint, with approval of the council, a city works superintendent who shall hold office for the duration of his appointment unless sooner removed by the mayor with the concurrence of the council. (Prior code §1-17-1).

2.32.020 Duties designated.

The city works superintendent shall have charge of the superintending of all municipal work as follows:

- A. *Streets and Alleys.* He shall supervise the grading, surfacing, repairs and maintenance of all streets and alleys.
- B. *Sewer.* He shall supervise the installation and maintenance of all sewer lines in the municipality, except the installation of sewer projects which are accomplished by contract.
- C. *Water.* He shall supervise the installation and maintenance of all water mains and water services, except the installation of water mains so accomplished by contract.
- D. *Electrical Manufacture and Distribution System.*
- E. *Equipment.* He shall have charge of and supervise the repair and upkeep of all city works equipment.
- F. *Employment and Supervision.* He may employ, with the consent of the governing body, such help as is needed to carry on the work of the city, and such help to be directly under his supervision.
- G. *Other Duties.* The superintendent shall be responsible for the accomplishment of such other work of the city which the governing body may from time to time assign to him.
- H. *To Make Report.* The superintendent shall present to the board at its regular meeting each month a written report of the city work accomplished the preceding month and also, as far as can be foreseen, city work planned for the current month. (Prior code sl-17-2)
